Registration Information

Directions:

Approaching Lewes EASTBOUND via Route 9 out of Georgetown, DE or SOUTHBOUND via Route 1 out of Dover, DE (about 35 miles southbound):

At the intersection of Route 1 and Business Route 9, take Business Route 9 (Savannah Road) into Lewes. This is a left turn off Route 1. Once in Lewes, continue on Savannah Road past the Zwaanendael Museum (on the right), two blocks to the first traffic light at the foot of the drawbridge over the canal. Do not cross the bridge, but turn left onto Front Street (which becomes Pilottown Road). Stay on this road 1.5 miles. Turn left into the College of Marine Studies entrance lane.
(See also alternate directions for Route 1 Southbound.)


Approaching Lewes NORTHBOUND on Route 1:

Take Kings Highway into Lewes (a right turn off Route 1). Make a left turn at the stop sign off Freeman Highway, then a right onto Savannah Road. Continue to the traffic light at the foot of the drawbridge over the canal. Do not cross the bridge, but turn left onto Front Street (which becomes Pilottown Road). Stay on this road 1.5 miles. Turn left into the College of Marine Studies entrance lane.

From Route 1 SOUTHBOUND:

Make a left at sign just before Nassau Bridge. Go 1/4 mile, then make a left onto New Road (at the Antique Barn). Continue approximately 3 miles to Pilottown Road. Turn left into the College of Marine Studies entrance lane.

A - 1: Developing a Healthy Brain

The importance of early childhood experiences on the development of the brain has come to light in the past decade and childcare professionals play an important role in that development. This workshop will give participants a basic understanding of how the brain develops and the impact early childhood experiences have on a child's developing mind.

Core Topic Area: Child Development

Presenter: Kellie Turner, Prevent Child Abuse Delaware

A-2: Shaken Baby Syndrome

This training will help participants to understand Shaken Baby Syndrome (SBS). It explores what constitutes SBS and what does not. Participants will learn the signs and symptoms of SBS and what they can do to prevent shaking a baby. They will also be given information they can pass on to the parents of the children in their care in order to prevent shaking a baby.

Core Topic Area: Safety

A-3: Pooh, Piglet and Tigger: Understanding Temperament Styles

Temperament influences a child's style of interaction as well as the way he/she understands the world. This workshop will help participants understand what temperament is and its five key traits. Participants will also examine how their temperament effects the interactions they have with the children in their care.

Series B Workshops 12:15 – 2:15

B-1: The 5 R's that Promote Healthy Brain Development

This workshop can be considered a continuation of the Developing a Healthy Brain workshop offered in Series A. Early care and education professionals spend a significant amount of time with small children and therefore have a important impact on the development of those children's brains. Participants will learn how to "build a healthy brain" using the 5 R's: relationships, respect, repetition, routines and responsive interaction. Participants will learn what the 5 R's are and how each ingredient supports and promotes healthy development and learning. Finally, discussion about incorporating these ingredients will be discussed.

Core Topic Area: Child Development

Presenter: Parents As Teachers

B-2: The Social Emotional Development of Young Children

Social-emotional development begins at birth and continues across a child's life. The foundation for healthy social-emotional development laid in the first three years of life helps establish meaningful relationships with parents, caregivers, and peers and supports his/her learning both in and out of school. Participants will learn what social-emotional development is, basic brain development and why the development is important. Participants will also learn developmental milestones and ways to expand a child's social-emotional growth.

Core Topic Area: Child Development

B-3: Healthy Habits for Life

This session will help providers who teach preschoolers (3-5 years of age) to support children's healthy eating habits and get the children more physically active through games and tools from an activity Tool Kit specially created for Nemours Health and Prevention Services by Sesame Workshop. At the end of the session, participants will take toolkits, which feature the lovable Sesame characters in print and DVD format back to their centers to use with their children.

C-1: Recognizing and Responding to Child Abuse

Participants will be able to define the four types of abuse as well as recognize the signs and symptoms of each type of abuse. Participants will also learn when and how to make a report to the Division of Family Services. Participants will learn appropriate ways to respond to a disclosure of abuse. Participants will also have the opportunity to practice these skills throughout the training.

C-2: Using the Stages of Parenting to Work Effectively with Parents

As children grow and change, so do their parents. Depending on where parents are in the stages of parent development, they will experience, understand and respond to their children's behavior differently. When child care professionals can appreciate where both the parents and the child are developmentally, they are better able to establish effective working relationships with the family as a whole.

C-3: Helping Children Develop Social Skills

An essential tool for positive interactions throughout our lives is having social skills. For kids who don't have these tools in their toolbox life can be more difficult. When kids are confident in the way they interact with others it leads to success in other areas of their lives. Help the children in your life become more successful by learning not only what social skills are but how to teach and model them.
