

Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA)

The Prison Rape Elimination Act of 2003 (PREA, P.L. 108-79) was enacted by Congress to address the problem of sexual abuse of persons in the custody of U.S. correctional agencies. The Act applies to all public and private institutions that house adult or juvenile offenders and is also relevant to community-based agencies. It addresses both inmate-on-inmate sexual abuse and staff sexual misconduct.

DYRS has a zero tolerance for any incidence of sexual activity with youth in our care. DYRS commits to full compliance with PREA and all criminal laws.

In compliance with PREA reporting standards, the list below shows the Calendar Year 2016 PREA Incident Reports filed in DYRS. As with any institutional abuse reports that involve children in our facilities, each incident is independently investigated by the DSCYF Institutional Abuse unit.

PREA "Type of Sexual Violence" Definitions *

Non-consensual Sexual Act	Contact between the penis, vagina, or anus including penetration, however slight, contact between the mouth and the penis, vagina, or anus, or penetration of the anal or genital opening by the hand, finger, or other object without the victim's consent.
Abusive Sexual Act	Intentional touching of the genitals, breasts, buttocks, etc., either directly or through clothing without the victim's consent.
Sexual Harassment	Repeated verbal statements or comments of a sexual nature to a juvenile by another juvenile, employee, volunteer, contractor, or other agency representatives. Comments include demeaning references to gender or derogatory comments about body or clothing, or repeated profane or obscene language or gestures.

PREA "RESULTS" Definitions *

Unfounded	The event was determined not to have occurred.
Unsubstantiated	Evidence was insufficient to make a final determination that the event occurred.
Substantiated	The event was investigated and determined to have occurred.

Division Annual Review of PREA Incidents

State Run Facilities

Every reportable event, whether PREA related or not, is reviewed by the facility Superintendent, Division Director, and Deputy Director. If the incident involves child abuse in the facility, the Department's Institutional Abuse Unit would investigate the incident to determine if there is sufficient evidence for further investigation. The facility superintendent also investigates to determine if proper policies and procedures were followed.

The above table shows there were five PREA related incidents, four sexual harassment accusations were determined to be unfounded or unsubstantiated, and one youth on youth Abusive Sexual Contact that was substantiated.

Delaware Youth placed in Contracted Residential Facilities

Reportable events that involve a Delaware youth are investigated by that provider's investigation procedures, and if applicable, the governmental agency that would investigate child abuse (county, township, state, etc.). Any event that involves a DYRS youth would be documented and communicated to the DYRS probation officer and the Department Contracts unit. The listed providers are those who have a population of 51% or more of juvenile justice youth.

The above table shows there were two related PREA incidents; both substantiated (youth on youth harassments).
